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## Detachable Peter Pan Collar:

So simple yet beautiful, isn't it? With this cute and easy to crochet detachable Peter Pan collar you pimp up any garment in a jiffy!

## A free Crochet Pattern for a detachable Peter Pan Collar

### Requirements

#### Supplies

Yarn: e.g. 100% cotton, size 3, in your fave colors, I used grey (C1) and cream (C2).

(Silk) ribbon in C2.

Crochet hook, size 3mm (as recommended on yarn). If you're a loose crocheteer better use a hook size smaller. Stitch marker (I use paper clips).

Yarn needle.

#### Stitches (american terminology)

You should be familiar with chains (casting on), single crochet, half double crochet, increasing and decreasing and crab (reverse) stitch.

#### Abbreviations

sc – single crochet, m – make, ch - chain, hdc – half double crochet

#### Generally

At the end of each row (except last) *always* make a turn chain (+1), even if not mentioned.

#### Rights

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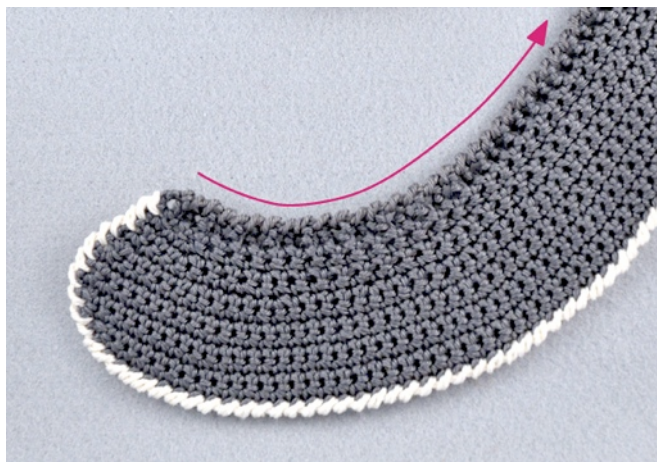
## Pattern

| Row  | Stitches | Description  |
|--|----------|--|
| 1  | 81 + 1   | chain 81, ch 1, turn   |
| 2  | 81+2     | skip 1, sc in each to the end, ch 2, turn  |
| 3  |          | <b>One and only special row</b><br><i>that's where you lace the ribbon through later</i><br>hdc across to the end, ch 1, turn  |
| <p>mark 41st st.<br/>that's our mirror point labelled in the following pattern with a vertical bar " ". It obviously indicates the point where you mirror all stitches :)<br/>Set marker a row higher as you go.</p> |          |  |
| 4  | 89 +1    | make 2 sc in 3rd, 6th, 9th, 12th   69th, 72th, 75th, 78th st, turn   |
| 5  | 98 +1    | make 2 sc in each 10th (to 80th), turn   |
| 6  | 108 +1   | make 2 sc in each 7th to 42th st   starting with 56st st, m 2 in each 7th to 91st st, sc to end turn<br><i>or</i><br>counting: 7th, 14th, 21th, 28th, 35th, 42nd   56st, 63th, 70th, 77th, 84th, 91th.                 |
| 7  | 120 +1   | make 2 sc in 12th, 24th   96th, 108th st, turn   |
| 8  |          | work even, turn  |
| 9  | 134 +1   | make 2 sc in each 8th st to 56th   starting with 64th st, m 2 in each 8th to 112th st, sc to end, turn<br><i>or</i><br>counting: 8th, 16th, 24th, 32nd, 40th, 48th, 56th   64th, 72nd, 80th, 88th, 96th, 104th, 112th. |
| 10   |          | work even, turn  |
| 11   | 132 +1   | dec 2nd and 2nd to last (133th) st, turn   |
| 12   |          | work even, turn  |
| 13   | 130 +1   | dec 3rd and 3rd to last (129th) st, turn   |
| 14   | 128 +1   | dec 2rd and 2nd to last (128th) st, end, hide yarn.  |
| Decide which one's your sunny side.  |          |  |

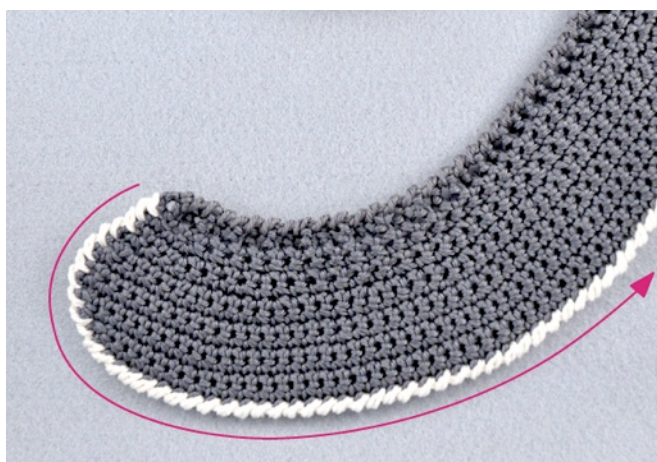
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## Finish



With the sunny side up, join C1 (grey) into 1st st, crab stitch (reverse stitch) to the end, end, hide yarn.



With the sunny side up, join C2 (cream) in 1st of 3rd row, crab stitch all around the curved side of you collar to the 3rd to last stitch on the other side, end, hide yarn.



Weave in all loose ends. Lace in your ribbon through the half-double-crochet row using a yarn needle.

And you are done! :)
